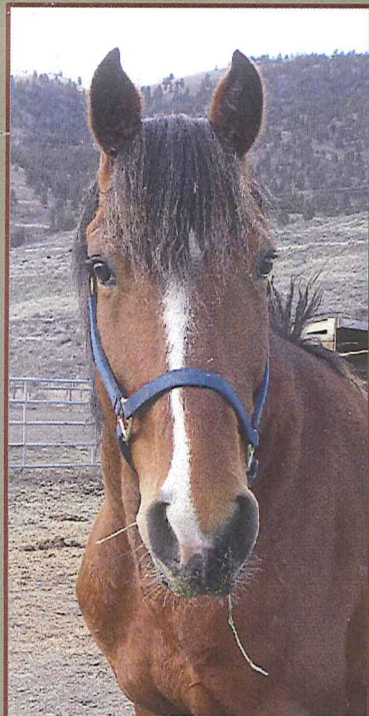

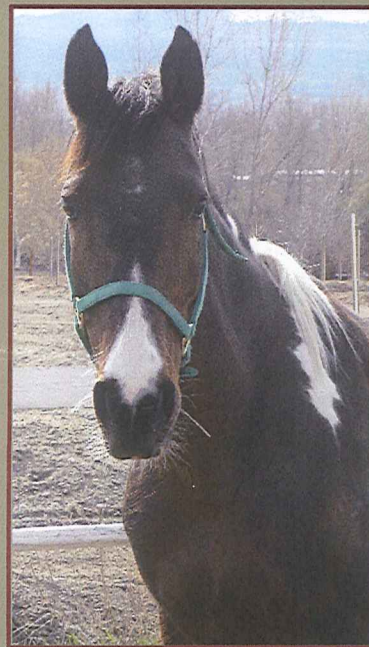
WAITING FOR LOVE

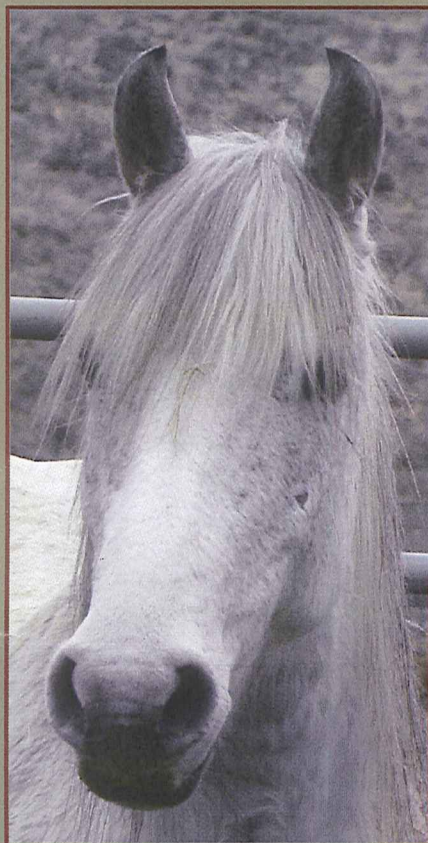

Avalon, pinto mare, small at 14-2 and est. at 3-4 years. She is doing well with halter training and starting to enjoy human contact. She is not "well put together" but don't let that stop you from seeing her potential! Remember, even Sea Biscuit was not considered to have good conformation! From such a harsh beginning, can you give her the life she deserves?



Arundel was released onto the land, forced to fend for herself she was not doing so well. She was thin, covered in ticks and likely would not have survived the winter. She bears the scars of a harsh life, once had a halter left on so long that her face literally started to grow into it. She has the permanent indentation on her beautiful nose forever. She bears no ill will, however, and is gentle and loving. Already saddle trained, she awaits someone who can love the "mature" horse. Her age is estimated to be 22. Fully vaccinated and just had her teeth floated. She is ready for adoption and love.
